Dear Parents/Guardians,

As we enter the Spring 2025 athletic season, the vacation attendance policy for varsity sports during the April break will remain consistent with the regular season. This adjustment, first introduced during the winter season, will continue as part of a pilot program and be reevaluated at the end of the spring season. Please note that JV attendance regulations remain unchanged.

**JV/Varsity Vacation Attendance Policy:**

- For each unexcused contest missed, the athlete will be "benched" for one contest at the coach's discretion.
- For every two unexcused practices missed, the athlete will be "benched" for one contest at the coach's discretion.

Consistent attendance is vital for both team success and the individual development of our student-athletes. The vacation calendar outlining our designated no-play dates remains unchanged. If practices or contests are scheduled on a no-play date, student-athletes will not be penalized for their absence.

Athletes' attendance and conditioning levels will play a significant role in determining their playing time. We strongly encourage student-athletes to maintain their fitness and training routines during no-play dates over the break.

As parents and guardians, your support in reinforcing the values of attendance and commitment is invaluable. Your encouragement helps strengthen the principles of teamwork and dedication that define the Roslyn athletic program.
