- 5. Short assignments—quizzes, short writing assignments, journals, classwork—make up thirty percent of your grade.
  - a. Journal entries provide an opportunity for you to respond to the literature you read. Journals are to be typed. In addition to answering questions posed, you can ask questions, make guesses, or try to get into the mind of the writer or character.
  - b. The writer's notebook will be used in class and will be kept in the classroom.
  - c. Quizzes given for vocabulary units are announced. Quizzes given for reading assignments are not announced.
- 6. Essays, exams, and projects make up forty-five percent of your grade. Exams and essays will be given upon completion of major assignments or units. This includes both literature and grammar units as well as summer reading. Projects will also be assigned. Essays or projects will be assigned for outside reading.
- 7. Homework makes up fifteen percent of your grade. Homework is an important part of the curriculum and will be given on a daily basis.
- 8. All assignments are to be completed independently. The penalty for receiving assistance from other people or the internet will result in a zero and a disciplinary referral. Please refer to the student handbook.
- 9. Participation makes up ten percent of your grade. Class participation is essential to class discussion; therefore, it is important to answer and ask questions. In addition to participation, this grade is determined by conduct during class and preparedness.
- 10. Depending on the number of assignments each quarter, I reserve the right to reallocate the points accordingly.
- 11. It is your responsibility to have your ipad charged and ready to use each day. iPad privileges may be taken away if not used appropriately.
- 12. No food or drinks (except water) is allowed in class.

- Bring your own pens to class every day. Only blue or black ink is permitted.
